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| 1 | Vivia, Le Mortelle, Antinori 2017<br>Tuscany, Italy<br>50% Vermentino, 40% Viognier, 10% Ansonica<br><br>The aromas recall ripe peaches, citrus peel, and candied fruit. The palate adds savoury mineral touches alongside notes of thyme and sage; the finish is crisp and persistent.   | £20.00 |
| 2 | Trebbiano Spoletino, Perticaia 2017<br>Umbria, Italy<br>100% Trebbiano Spoletino<br><br>Delicious wine from an ultra-rare grape variety, offering citrus and pear fruit flavours, a full texture in the mouth, and a satisfying mineral finish.   | £21.00 |
| 3 | Rosso di Montalcino, Pian Delle Vigne, Antinori 2015<br>Tuscany, Italy<br>100% Sangiovese<br><br>This wine shows aromas of ripe red fruit, with floral and spicy notes adding lift and complexity. The palate is medium-bodied and succulent, with a persistent juicy freshness.  | £27.00 |
| 4 | Botrosecco, Le Mortelle, Antinori 2015<br>Tuscany, Italy<br>60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 40% Cabernet Franc  | £24.00 |
| 5 | Badia a Passignano Chianti Classico Riserva 2013<br>Tuscany, Italy<br>100% Sangiovese<br><br>The nose offers a wide range of fruity aromas as well as hints of liquorice and ripe blackberries. The complex, elegant palate shows plenty of fruit alongside savoury flavours, finishing long and vibrant.   | £46.00 |
| 6 | Albareda Sforzato di Valtellina, Mamete Prevostini 2013<br>Lombardy, Italy<br>100% Nebbiolo<br><br>Sforzato is effectively an Amarone made with Nebbiolo, and this thrilling example offers concentrated spice and red fruit aromas alongside sultana and dried flowers. The palate is very full-bodied, though not heavy, lifted by bright acidity and sheer exuberance. | £60.00 |
